

She is currently pursuing mathematics at Columbia University, specializing in differential geometry under world-renowned mathematicians, Richard S. Hamilton and Simon Brendle. This January, she will be performing Brünnhilde (Die Walküre) with NYDV, following her first appearance as Siegrune (Die Walküre) this past summer with Miami Music Festival. She participated in the Boston Wagner Institute in 2021. Ms. Li grew up in Europe and North America

before her family settled in Wellesley, MA, where she attended high school. She has knowledge of German, Japanese, French, among others.



Katharine Meagher, Sieglinde, is the first ever female singer with low-vision to have performed with Detroit Opera in their Artist Outreach program. She is a champion for differently abled performers, especially in the opera realm. In 2023, Katharine was the inaugural recipient of the Josh Killingsworth Scholarship which enabled her to travel to Germany to sing Siegrune in Die Walkure with Dramatic Voices Program Berlin. Katharine has also been seen as La Cieca in La Gioconda with Opera Modo. She was a semifinalist in the Lois Alba Aria Competition as well as in

the Elizabeth Connell Prize for Dramatic Sopranos. Past opera credits include Fiordiligi (Cosi fan tutte), Sorceress (Dido and Aeneas), Third Spirit (Magic Flute), Geraldine (A Hand of Bridge), Anna Maurrant (Street Scene), Leonora (La forza del Destino), Norma (Norma), Magda (The Counsul), Countess (La Nozze di Figaro), Desdemona(Otello), Donna Anna (Don Giovanni), Mimi (La boheme), and Miss Pinkerton (Old Maid and the Thief.



Fallon Nunes, Gerhilde, is a San Jose native with an BM from the University of Redlands and an MA from San Jose State University. She is an accomplished performer in both Musical Theater and Opera. In 2023, she portrayed the titular role in Puccini's Suor Angelica at FIO in Urbania, Italy. A longtime member of the Opera San José chorus, she has performed in productions like Madama Butterfly and the 2017 North American premiere of Cinderella. In 2024, she covered the 2nd Lady in The Magic Flute. Ms. Nunes teaches voice and piano across the Silicon Valley.



Joanna Parisi, Brünnhilde. In 2024, Joanna Parisi sang Brünnhilde in Die Walküre with the Miami Wagner Institute, "a soprano to watch, rich in voice and beauty, the dream Brünnhilde." She is a finalist in the world's largest Wagnerian opera competition, the Lauritz Melchior International Competition in Denmark. In 2023, she sang Elsa in Lohengrin at Utah Festival Opera, "born to sing this Wagnerian role", "an astounding soprano with radiant high notes that gleam luminously onstage. Her command of her instrument is dazzling." She received accolades from The

Metropolitan Opera National Council, Operalia, The Next Generation of Great Opera Singers by WQXR, and praise from NY Times, Opera Magazine, Opera News, NY Observer. Recognized internationally in leading opera roles of Verdi and Wagner, she was awarded the Callas Tribute Prize from the Italian Consulate in NY.



Rachel Pépin, Cover Gerhilde. Canadian soprano Rachel Pépin will cover Gerhilde in Act III of Die Walküre with New York Dramatic Voices this January. Having graduated from McGill University with distinction, Rachel was honored with the esteemed Graduate Excellence Fellowship. During her studies, she performed the roles of Elle in Poulenc's La Voix Humaine and the Mother in Hänsel und Gretel with Opera McGill. More recently, she appeared as a Foreign Woman in The

Consul by Menotti at the Chicago Summer Opera Program (2024). Known for her expressive voice and compelling stage presence, Rachel brings depth and authenticity to every performance.



Jenny Ribeiro, Ortlinde, Award-winning soprano Jenny Ribeiro has been seen on opera, concert and recital stages throughout the United States and Europe. Highlights include the European premiere of The Ghosts of Versailles in Hannover, Germany, and the American premieres of Kinkakuji and The Dreyfus Affair for the New York City Opera. Among the opera companies for which she has directed most of the standard repertoire are New York City Opera, Syracuse, Kansas City, San

Francisco, Austin, Cleveland, Chautauqua, Connecticut, New Orleans, El Paso, Dayton Opera, Anchorage, and Tri-Cities Opera. He is the orchestra manager of Parlando, a graduate of Manhattan School of Music and New York University, and the owner of Bachovich Music Publications.



Husan Chun-Novak, has collaborated as **assistant conductor** and opera pianist for 30 years at renowned theaters, including Theater an der Wien, Mariinsky Theater, Teatro de la Zarzuela, Palau de les Arts, and Maryland Lyric Opera. She has collaborated with distinguished conductors and singers such as Danielle Callegari, Speranza Scappucci, José Carreras, Gregory Kunde, Ermonela Jaho, just to name a few. As a vocal coach, she taught at various international opera studios and Viennese Music University. As a collaborative pianist, she played at Musikverein

Wien, Teatro Real Madrid, and theaters across Europe.



Anthony Laciura, ALFA President and Founder, is most recently known as 'Eddie Kessler', the right-hand man to Steve Buscemi's 'Nucky Thompson' on four seasons of HBO's highly acclaimed series, *Boardwalk Empire*. Mr. Laciura is the recipient of two SAG Actor awards for Outstanding Performance by an Ensemble in a Drama Series for his role on *Boardwalk Empire*. Entertainment Weekly has named Mr. Laciura in the top 25 Comic Relief in TV Dramas All-Stars, for his portrayal

of 'Eddie'. Mr. Laciura can also be seen regularly on Netflix. Most recently, he played the role of Leonard in Netflix's original Like Father opposite Kelsey Grammer and Kristen Bell. Mr. Laciura has also appeared with the Metropolitan Opera Company in more than 800 performances and is known internationally for his work as an operatic tenor. The first time Mr. Laciura debuted at the Met was with Pavarotti in 1982, in the opera Der Rosenkavalier, by Richard Strauss. Laciura then recorded Manon Lescaut by Puccini on the Deutche Grammaphone label with Pavarotti, and finally, Laciura appeared with Pavarotti in his last scheduled gala at the Met, in Tosca by Puccini. Mr. Laciura's recorded Madama Butterfly with Jose Carreras on the Deutche Grammaphone label and toured with him on several productions. During Mr. Laciura's time as a comprimario at the Met, the Washington Post labeled him... "The Clown Prince of Opera...one of the outstanding character-tenors of our time." The New York Times' leading music critic simply stated that he is "a master of such roles," and Terrence McNally announced during a radio broadcast that, "the amazing Anthony Laciura can convince an audience that he is just about anyone and sometimes steals the show," and named him as a "Singer of the Century." His Off-Broadway stage credits include Uncle Bob in The House of Connelly by Paul Green, Irwin in the 2014 production of Honor Bound by Al Repicci, and as Reb Pinchas and Moisheleh in the musical Soul Doctor, directed by Mindy Cooper. Mr. Laciura's talent as a unique character actor has taken him to the big screen, television, and on various stages throughout the world. He has co-starred in the Academy qualifying, multi-award winning independent short film Crackers, as Frank the Barber, directed by Gregory Principato, and in the short film Mateo's Room as Mr. Thomas, by Maximilian Williamson. In addition to his singing career and acting, Anthony also directs opera. Recent directing includes The Barber of Seville for Martina Arroyo's Prelude to Performance. He has also directed productions of Verdi's Otello with the Vero Beach Opera, Purcell's Dido and Aeneas, Puccini's La Boheme, Tosca, Madama Butterfly for Phoenix Opera, Verdi's Rigoletto for DiCapo Opera in New York, and Puccini's La fanciulla del West at Knoxville Opera. Mr. Laciura is the founder of the Anthony Laciura Foundation for the Arts, Inc. whose mission is to raise funds and to receive contributions to teach, promote and showcase opportunities for dramatic voices and artists by providing opportunities to hone their crafts under the tutelage of professionals in the business who are at the top of their careers, working one-on-one with masters of the arts, reviewing their professional materials, apprenticeships, professional outreach, combining all art forms, bringing to the community rarely performed works of art, and creating new work to perform. At this moment, New York Dramatic Voices is the sole project of Anthony Laciura Foundation for the Arts, Inc. Equally at home on the concert stage, Ms. Helvick made her Carnegie Hall debut as the alto soloist in Beethoven's Choral Fantasy and Händel's Coronation Mass. Other concert highlights include Mahler's Resurrection Symphony, Brahms' Zigeunelieder, and Berg's Sieben frühe Lieder.
